TOP DOG/UNDERDOG By Suzan-Lori Parks

Costume Plot

Lincoln – the top dog - late 30's

Booth (aka 3-card), the underdog – early 30's

Note: Play marked in scenes only; not acts

Scene One - Thursday evening, mid winter

Booth – street clothes (props) gun

Lincoln – antique frock coat, stovepipe top hat, fake beard "worn spots on elbows, shiny strips around cuffs & collar, dust from cap guns on left shoulder (script note)

Scene Two – Friday evening, the very next day

Booth – large coat that hides 2 pair new shoes w/socks in sleeves and 2 belts (underdressed) 2 new suit jackets and pants* w/tags attached, 2 neckties in pockets and 2 folded shirts tucked in back of pants (props) magazine, regular pants, shirt & shoes as base layer. *Script note – Booth's suit is brown; Lincoln's suit is blue Lincoln tie is bright; Booth's is subdued (they switch)

Lincoln – street clothes & coat and costume – Frock coat, pants, beard, top hat w/elastic band, necktie

Scene Three – same Friday evening, much later

Lincoln - repeat Abe Lincoln regalia

Booth – repeat shoplifted suit ensemble

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Scene Four - Saturday, just before dawn

Lincoln - repeat Lincoln outfit, strips down to t-shirt & shorts

Scene Five - Wednesday night

Booth – repeat shoplifted suit, coat w/gun (props) (props) matching silk dressing gowns marked "His" and "Hers" laid out on bed

Lincoln - wearing Frock coat (carrying costume vest in a bag)

Scene Six - Thursday night

Lincoln - (drunk) repeat street clothes and Abe Lincoln attire

Booth - street clothes
